
#### Legislator Testa Helps Bring Legal Services to Northern Westchester

Back in 2013, Legislator Testa fought for funding in the budget to establish a local presence of the Legal Services of the Hudson Valley (LSHV) in the Cortlandt / Peekskill/Yorktown region. The program provides free legal services for eligible Veterans and Seniors as well as their domestic violence program. This year the LSHV opened and Legislator Testa took part in the opening ceremony.

LSHV does not provide legal assistance for criminal charges but does provide a broad range of advocacy and representation to elderly and veteran clients in practice areas including housing, benefits, Medicaid, future planning, and home care cases. #### Testa Delivers Funds for Roads



Back in August, Testa announced \$2.8 million in funding for road repairs in Peekskill. Legislator Testa secured the funding through a Bond Act which received bipartisan support in unanimous vote.

The Bond Act provided money to rehabilitate critical sections of North and South Division Street and Crompond Road.

One section of the rehab work will cover a distance of approximately 1.38 miles of South Division Street in the City of Peekskill, from South Street to the Cortlandt/Peekskill Town Line. The other section of road that will be rehabilitated is .31 miles of North Division Street from South Division to Highland Avenue. The projects will include milling, resurfacing, replacement or adjustment of utility castings, concrete curb replacement, installation of handicap ramps, new traffic loops, and new pavement markings. The work is expected to last 9-12 months.



### 2015 Bipartisan Budget Passes, 5th Straight Year of No Tax Increase

The Board of Legislators passed another zero tax increase county budget for 2015, the fifth consecutive year they have succeeded in keeping county taxes flat. The budget was passed by a bipartisan group of Legislators by 10-7 vote. Following the vote Legislator Testa said "This was a tough budget that required us to make difficult decisions but at the end of our negotiations with the County Executive and Democrats on the Board, we were able to craft a plan that keeps taxes flat, protects the County's favorable credit rating and provides a strong social safety net for our low income families."

Legislator Testa is a member of the Budget and Appropriations Committee. Many department heads, commissioners and county government staff members appeared before the Committee. Their input has enabled members of the Board and the County Executive to reach consensus on some of the more difficult issues in the 2015 budget. The Budget and Appropriations Committee held three Public Hearings on the county budget. The Legislators heard from an array of citizens, non-profits and service providers. One group who spoke and really made an impression on the Legislators were young men from Youth Shelters, The BOL added \$70,000 for the youth shelters, increased funding for childcare for low income working families and legal services for the elderly and the Hispanic community.



## Lincoln Depot Museum Opens



On Saturday, October 18, 2014 the Lincoln Depot Museum held its official Ribbon Cutting Grand Opening event. After ten years of persistence the museum became a reality. Through the process of obtaining the historic building in 2003, being awarded the NYS grants to first restore the exterior of the structure and then restore and adapt the interior to hold the planned museum the project kept moving forward. www.lincolndepotmuseum.org






### Testa Helps Aquire Emergency Vehicle for Northern Westchester
